FOURTH YEAR: 1st semester

- KIBER students study at one of our partner universities abroad.
- Many partner universities require KIBER students to provide a TOEFL (iBT) score of usually 80 or above. Students need to have achieved this score by the end of October in the third quarter.
- Partner universities in the United Kingdom (e.g., Cardiff University) ask for an IELTS score, usually of 6.5.
- No additional tuition fees are charged to KIBER students who study at partner universities. However, it is important that KIBER students and their families know that they will be responsible for expenses related to traveling, living, insurance, and other out of pocket expenses during their stay period abroad. They should recognize also that living costs vary depending on which partner university KIBER students are assigned to.
- KIBER students can apply for scholarships and other sources of financial support, including JASSO, HUMAP, TOBITATE NEXT JAPAN, GYOMU SUPER JAPAN DREAM and Kobe University Fund.
